

Dear Upper Arlington,

The Upper Arlington Public Library saw a year of significant progress in 2024, marked by outstanding programs, impactful events, and the official launch of our Master Facilities Plan, ensuring long-term sustainability for our community spaces.

We took the first steps by replacing HVAC systems at two branches, enhancing energy efficiency and comfort. The Lane Road Branch renovation officially began, bringing longneeded updates to the space, including a first-floor reconfiguration and plans for improved shelving and meeting room furniture, supported by a dedicated fundraising campaign for the Youth Department.

Behind the scenes, we strengthened our collections and circulation philosophy, making strategic investments in Overdrive Advantage for better digital access, launching a Quick Pick collection, and tailoring collections to fit the unique needs of each location. We continued our marketing enhancements, including branding standardization, website redesign, and outdoor signage renovations, reinforcing our identity and outreach efforts.


Library use continues to climb with an increase in visits, computer use, and program and event attendance.

Circulation Trends

In five years, print book checkouts have increased by 30%, our digital circulation by 88%, and video games by 780%! The collections with the sharpest decline are audiobooks, music, and movies.

In 2024, we introduced Quick Picks – popular titles available for immediate checkout. They can't be reserved, making them perfect for browsers.






Continued investment in collections

We increased our total collection budget by 1.5%, including a boost to the print book budget of almost 5%. We added \$100,000 to our eBook and streaming audiobook budget to keep up with the increasing demand.



We sustained a \$170,000 loss from the Public Library Fund in 2024, a result of tax cuts impacting the State Budget. Fortunately, the revenue from our interest rates offset the loss. Library revenue is projected to remain flat for the foreseeable future.


